REQUEST:

The Juvenile Division of the Circuit Court is requesting an increase in funds to cover expenses for placement costs as ordered by the court for juvenile delinquents and children subject to child protection proceedings, who come under our jurisdiction.

As we have seen a rise in the number of children coming under the jurisdiction of the court, we have also seen a rise in the number of placements and the cost of those placements. Many of the children in placement suffer from severe mental health diagnoses or trauma that limit their ability to be placed due to the high level of care they require. Due to the limitations in finding appropriate placements, when a placement does come available the court with directions from the DHHS makes immediate decisions for the best interest of the children. These decisions coupled with the required care led to high monthly costs for caring for our youth.

The Juvenile Division of the Circuit Court is requesting a budget increase to the Child Care Fund in the amount of \$650,000.00 for the 2024-2025 fiscal year and part of the 2025-2026 fiscal year. Although we are asking for the full amount, the county will be reimbursed 50% by the State of Michigan.

FINANCE:

The court is always attempting to make decisions for our youth with the counties fiscal interest in mind. We explore many options before placement is considered which can lead to additional funding requests such as this. However, do to the influx in placements for both juvenile youth and child protection cases, we are requesting an immediate budget adjustment be made so we can rectify our balance with the State of Michigan.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Court requests that the Committee review and recommend that additional funds be allocated to the Juvenile Division of the Circuit Court for immediate payment to the service providers in our community and the Board Chair be authorized to sign any required documents.

Unified Work Program (UWP).

Background:

The Bay City Area Transportation Study (BCATS) serves as the federally certified transportation planning organization in the urbanized area of Bay County. BCATS is led by Bay County (Transportation Planning) and is comprised of local representation from the Bay County Road Commission, City of Bay City, City of Essexville, Bay Metropolitan Transit Authority, and the townships of Bangor, Frankenlust, Kawkawlin, Hampton, Portsmouth, and Monitor. Together, BCATS does the critical planning necessary to identify transportation planning needs such as access management studies and the actual road improvement projects needed throughout the urbanized area. The BCATS planning activities are described in the attached 2025 Unified Work Program (UWP). The UWP is a requirement that serves as the basis for transportation funding by the Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT), the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), and Federal Transit Administration (FTA) for both road work as well as planning.

Because careful planning is so critical to road improvement projects, both the MDOT and FHWA provide annual transportation planning funding to Bay County to support BCATS as the Municipal Planning Organization (MPO) necessary to develop the UWP. This funding for BCATS is provided though annual Project Authorizations (PA) which serve as official contracts between BCATS and MDOT, FHWA, and FTA.

Typically, the PA allows reimbursement for planning-related activities, (BCATS work) and requires approval from the Bay County Board of Commissioners in order to utilize federal funds for road construction projects in the Bay City Urbanized Area. However, in the past year, the annual BCATS Project Authorization was completed without approval from the Bay County Board of Commissioners. This request is to retroactively approve the current Fiscal Year 2025 FHWA planning (PL) and FTA planning (5303) funds, and annual Asset Management Funds, which are used specifically for the required annual Asset Management tasks performed on federal aid roads within Bay County.

Federal Highway Administration grant funds are passed through the Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) and used to support the activities of the Bay County Transportation Planning Program. FHWA PL funds are also used for transit planning activities, which are passed through Bay County to Bay Metropolitan Transportation Authority (BMTA, aka Bay Metro). These pass-through funds require a subcontract between BCATS and BMTA that allows BMTA to bill MDOT for planning funds. Likewise, the subcontract detailing the pass-through funding and BMTA local match amounts was not executed for Fiscal Year 2025.

Finance/Economics:

Current 2025 federal funding amounts received for each program area are as follows: BCATS PL federal funding amount \$217,230; BMTA PL federal funding amount \$44,739, and Asset Management funding amount \$19,900. Local match for transportation planning is provided through \$58,091 in cash contributions from the City of Bay City, City of Essexville, Bay County Road Commission, and Bay Metropolitan Transportation Authority, which is then reimbursed to these agencies through the course of the United Work Program activities. Bay County indirect costs are included and are part of the covered expenses of this grant.

Recommendation:

We request acknowledgment from the Board Chair for the FY 2025 Project Authorization forms, as well as authorization for the Board Chair to sign the BCATS – BMTA Subcontract documents and any other required contracts or documents including budget adjustments as necessary to implement the BCATS FY 2025 Unified Work Program (Attached) after Corporation Counsel review and approval.

Unified Work Program (UWP).

Background:

The Bay City Area Transportation Study (BCATS) serves as the federally certified transportation planning organization in the urbanized area of Bay County. BCATS is led by Bay County (Transportation Planning) and is comprised of local representation from the Bay County Road Commission, City of Bay City, City of Essexville, Bay Metropolitan Transit Authority, and the townships of Bangor, Frankenlust, Kawkawlin, Hampton, Portsmouth, and Monitor. Together, BCATS does the critical planning necessary to identify transportation planning needs such as access management studies and the actual road improvement projects needed throughout the urbanized area. The BCATS planning activities are described in the attached 2026 Unified Work Program (UWP). The UWP is a requirement that serves as the basis for transportation funding by the Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT), the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), and Federal Transit Administration (FTA) for both road work as well as planning.

Because careful planning is so critical to road improvement projects, both the MDOT and FHWA provide annual transportation planning funding to Bay County to support BCATS as the Municipal Planning Organization (MPO) necessary to develop the UWP. This funding for BCATS is provided though annual Project Authorizations (PA) which serve as official contracts between BCATS and MDOT, FHWA, and FTA.

As in past years, the PA allows reimbursement for planning-related activities, (BCATS work) and requires approval from the Bay County Board of Commissioners in order to utilize federal funds for road construction projects in the Bay City Urbanized Area. This request is for authorization to utilize Fiscal Year 2026 for FHWA planning (PL) and FTA planning (5303) funds, and annual Asset Management Funds, which are used specifically for the required annual Asset Management tasks performed on federal aid roads within Bay County.

Federal Highway Administration grant funds are passed through the Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) and used to support the activities of the Bay County Transportation Planning Program, further described in the FY 2026 Unified Work Program. FHWA PL funds are also used for transit planning activities which are passed through Bay County to Bay Metropolitan Transportation Authority (BMTA, aka Bay Metro). These pass-through funds require a subcontract between BCATS and BMTA that allows BMTA to bill MDOT for planning funds.

Finance/Economics:

Anticipated 2026 federal funding amounts for each program area are as follows: BCATS PL federal funding amount \$221,546; BMTA PL federal funding amount \$43,111, and Asset Management funding amount \$19,900. Local match for transportation planning is provided through \$58,687 in cash contributions from the City of Bay City, City of Essexville, Bay County Road Commission, and Bay Metropolitan Transportation Authority which is then reimbursed to these agencies

through the course of the United Work Program activities. Bay County indirect costs are included and are part of the covered expenses of this grant.

Recommendation:

We request authorization for the Board Chair to sign the FY 2026 Project Authorization forms, the BCATS – BMTA Subcontract documents and any other required contracts or documents including budget adjustments as necessary to implement the BCATS FY 2026 Unified Work Program (Attached) after Corporation Counsel review and approval.

Request:

For the Bay County Board of Commissioners to authorize a budget adjustment of up to \$20,000 for steam boiler / boiler room repairs at the Law Enforcement

Center.

Background:

The boilers at the LEC need repairs before heating season is in high gear. There is a hot water circulation pump that is leaking due to the bearings and seals failing. This very large circulation pump is tied into the system and therefore requires it to be rebuilt in place as it can't be removed and taken to a shop to be repaired. The low water controls require an upgrade to the system and there are isolation values that need to replaced. Many of the requirements to repair

this boiler were reported during our CSD1 inspection.

Economics:

A budget adjustment of up to \$20,000 is necessary for these repairs.

Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Board authorize a budget adjustment of up to \$20,000 for boiler work at the LEC, authorize the Board chairman to sign

documents related to this work.
