 first responder personnel receive access to wireless network resources first, ahead of other
 customers.
- 3. Security Protect the usability and integrity of the first responder network and data. Including both hardware and software technologies.
- 4. Safety and Efficiency Share information including location, directions and patient emergency medical data.

WHEREAS,	Health care costs continue to rise for all Americans and, for some Americans, this increase can
