WHEREAS,	As a part of Bay County Mosquito Control's source reduction program, two scrap tire drives are held each summer to provide a means for homeowners to dispose of unwanted tires and in 2020, 2,008 scrap tires were recycled in Bay County through this collection; and

WHEREAS,	The Director of Environmental Affairs and Community Development is requesting authorization to hire Alicia Wallace on a temporary basis for up to 280 hours to help during this critical transition and assist in the 2021 season to ensure all safety and regulatory requirements are met in a timely manner and to provide no disruption in local service; and
WHEREAS,	The Gypsy Moth Suppression Program is funded through a millage approved and supported by the residents of Bay County; and
WHEREAS,	The program provides monitoring and treatment of invasive pests in Bay County including Gypsy Moth and Emerald Ash Borer (EAB) that have the potential to defoliate and damage trees which can pose a public safety hazard; and
