WHEREAS,	JoAnne G. Weaver will long be remembered for the importance of the work she has done and the lives of the youth she has touched over her 55 years as a dedicated volunteer; Therefore, Be It

WHEREAS,	On October 18, 2018, the Personnel Department assisted Bay County Probate Court with posting the Youth and Family Counselor position county wide and, from this, two applications were received, neither of which were current county employees; and
WHEREAS,	After interviewing both candidates, the individual most qualified and suited for the position declined the Court's offer and this was due, in part, to the rate of pay; and
WHEREAS,	In November, with the assistance of the Personnel Department, this position was posted externally through Indeed. At that time, an influx of resumes were received which resulted in five candidates. Of these five candidates, two were interviewed for the position, and again, the most qualified and suitable applicant declined the Court's offer. This was, again, due in part to the rate of pay; and
WHEREAS,	Through research and communication with organizations in our region, Probate Court has come to the conclusion that in order to fill this position the pay scale needs to be raised to align this position with other comparable positions; and
WHEREAS,	Probate Court is seeking Board approval to grant a pay scale increase in order to attract viable candidates for this position within Probate Court; and
WHEREAS,	There is no impact to the current year's budget; Therefore, Be It
