WHEREAS,	The Drain Office has been working to complete an improvement project for the Hoppler Creek Drain which provides drainage in Williams Township an agreement to finance the project is required; and
WHEREAS,	Working with the Bay County Treasurer, an innovative funding alternative has been developed which saves this type of project tens-of-thousands of dollars; and
WHEREAS,	The Bay County Treasurer has significant funds to invest on an ongoing basis and part of her investment strategy is purchasing municipal investments; and
WHEREAS,	The Treasurer has suggested she would like the opportunity to invest in a Bay County municipal offering as opposed to buying other county's debt; and
WHEREAS,	The benefit to the Drainage District is that tens-of-thousands of dollars are saved by avoiding bonding costs or fees and the benefit for the County is the interest rate is a bit higher than other municipal investments so both parties benefit; and
WHEREAS,	An agreement has been prepared for the Hoppler Creek Drain and Section 434 of the Drain Code allows for funding from the County; and
WHEREAS,	In addition, the Drain Commissioner has the Authority under the Drain Code to represent the Drain District; and
WHEREAS,	Board approval is necessary for the Treasurer to provide the funding; and
WHEREAS,	As with all Drain projects, the Drain Commissioner has followed the Drain Code in developing this project and has created the necessary assessment rolls and notified the impacted governmental units; no appeals have been filed, so the project and the repayment of the funds are secure; and
WHEREAS,	\$2,150,000.00 in funding is being requested and, while this has been a difficult project to address, the Drain Commissioner and the Treasurer are confident everything possible has been done to make it as affordable as possible yet still address the flooding issues. Please do not hesitate to contact me with any questions; Therefore, Be It

RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING A BROWNFIELD REDEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY FOR THE COUNTY OF BAY AND APPOINTING BOARD MEMBERS PURSUANT TO AND IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF ACT 381 OF THE PUBLIC ACTS OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN OF 1996, AS AMENDED

At a regular meeting of the Bay County Board of Commissioners (Commission) of Bay County, Michigan (the "Local Unit"), held in the Local Unit on the 10th day of March, 2020, at 4 p.m.

PRESENT: COMM. DURANCZYK, KRYGIER, BEGICK, COONAN, HEREK, RYDER, LUTZ

ABSENT: NONE

SUPPORTED BY: COMM. LUTZ

WHEREAS, the Bay County Commission, by Resolution adopted on the 11th day of February, 2020 (the "Resolution of Intent"), determined that it is in the best interest of the public to facilitate identification and treatment of environmentally distressed, functionally obsolete and/or blighted areas to promote revitalization within the municipal limits of Bay County, and declared its intention to provide for the operation of a Brownfield Redevelopment Authority (the "Authority") for Bay County pursuant to and in accordance with the provisions of the Brownfield Redevelopment Financing Act, being Act 381 of the Public Acts of the State of Michigan of 1996, as amended the (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, on this date, pursuant to and in accordance with the Act and the Resolution of Intent, the Bay County Commission held a public hearing, notice of which was given as required by Section 4(2) of the Act on the adoption of a resolution creating the Authority; and

WHEREAS, all citizens, taxpayers and property owners of the County of Bay and officials of the affected taxing jurisdictions had the right and opportunity to be heard at the public hearing on the establishment of the Authority; and

WHEREAS, the Bay County Commissioner desires to proceed with the establishment of the Authority for the County of Bay within the boundaries of which the Authority shall exercise its powers, all pursuant to and in accordance with the Act.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. Authority Created. Pursuant to the authority vested in the Bay County Commission by the Act, the Authority is hereby established and shall be known as the Bay County Brownfield Redevelopment Authority.

- 2. Supervision of the Authority. The Authority shall be under the supervision and control of a board (the "Board") appointed by the Chair of the Bay County Commission, in accordance with the membership provisions set forth in Section 5(1) of the Act, subject to the approval of the Bay County Commission. The members of the Board shall hold office, and the Board shall conduct its procedures in accordance with the Act, and, in particular, Section 5 thereof.
- 3. Jurisdiction of the Authority. The Authority shall exercise its powers within the County of Bay.
- 4. Powers and Duties of the Authority. The Authority shall have the full extent of powers and duties provided by and in accordance with the Act. Among other matters, the exercise of its powers, the Board shall prepare Brownfield Plans for eligible property(ies) pursuant to Section 13 of the Act and submit the plan to the Bay County Commission for consideration pursuant to Section 14 of the Act.
- 5. Bylaws and Rules of the Authority. The Authority shall elect officers and adopt bylaws and rules governing its procedures and meetings in accordance with Sections 5(3) and 5(5) of the Act, and after adoption by the Board shall immediately forward a copy of the bylaws and rules to the Bay County Commission in care of the Clerk of Bay County (the "Clerk"). The Authority's bylaws and rules shall be subject to the approval of the Bay County Commission. However, if the Bay County Commission fails to either approve or disapprove the Authority's bylaws and rules at its next regular meeting after receipt of a copy thereof by the Clerk, the Authority's bylaws and rules shall be deemed to have been approved by the Bay County Commission.
- 6. Director's Bond. In the event the Board elects to employ a director as authorized by Section 6(1) of the Act, the director, before entering upon the duties of his/her office, shall, in addition to any other requirements of law, post a bond in the penal sum of \$__NA __ with a \$__NA __ deductible payable to the Authority for the use and benefit of the Authority, which shall be approved by the Board and filed with the Clerk. The premium on the bond furnished by the director shall be deemed to be an operating expense of the Authority, payable from funds available to the Authority for expenses of operation.
- 7. Form of Approvals. Except as may otherwise be provided by the Act or other applicable law, approvals by the Bay County Commission of all matters pertaining to the Authority or its Board shall be by resolution.
- 8. Severability. Should any section, clause or phase of this Resolution be declared invalid by the courts, the same shall not affect the validity of this Resolution as a whole nor any part thereof other than the part so declared to be invalid.
- 9. Repeals. All resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict with any of the provisions of this Resolution are hereby repealed.

10. Publication. The Clerk is hereby directed to file a true and complete copy with the Michigan Department of State, Office of the Great Seal, promptly after adoption and to take all other actions incident upon such adoption pursuant to applicable charter or other provisions UPON A VOTE FOR THE ADOPTION OF SAID RESOLUTION, THE VOTE WAS:

WHEREAS, the Administrative Services Director has solicited quotes for such an architectural/engineering/planning review and recommendation and has received two proposals to date, with the highest estimate equaling approximately \$64,000 (not including a property survey, which would cost an estimated \$5,000-\$7,000) and is awaiting quotes/proposals from additional firms; and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that, due to time constraints involved (including limited time prior to issuance of a ballot initiative and limited availability of qualified firms to prepare a report and recommendation within that time frame), the amount to retain the needed architectural/engineering firm falls under the "Emergency Purchase" Exemption of the Bay County Purchasing Policy and therefore the Administrative Services Director may retain the services of such a firm without the need to engage in the competitive sealed bidding process; Therefore, Be It
