WHEREAS,	After a thorough evaluation of the firms that responded to the Request for Qualifications, the RFQ committee has determined that Segal Waters Consulting offers the best value for Bay County. The Classification and Compensation study will include proposed job descriptions, updated FLSA determinations and evaluation of both internal and external pay equity; and
WHEREAS,	In addition, the firm will provide a proposed updated wage program that will allow internal maintenance of positions in the future should new positions be added or changed; and
WHEREAS,	The bid for the services provided by Segal Waters Consulting is \$100,000 and a budget adjustment for these funds is required; Therefore, Be It

WHEREAS,	An investment of \$176,000 for VHF pager tower site infrastructure was awarded over the past several years, the investment made possible through a private grant; and
WHEREAS,	The infrastructure upgrades were necessitated by FCC narrow banding requirements and, subsequently, a qualitative study was conducted by 9-1-1 Central Dispatch to review fire paging capability; and
WHEREAS	The study found that poor pager performance is resulting in inadequate fire pager coverage as the current condition of a majority of existing fire pagers is poor, at best; and
WHEREAS	The existing fire pagers are incapable of monitoring four frequencies which further limits access to county-wide fire pager coverage; and
WHEREAS,	The Fire Departments throughout Bay County have decided to collaborate by submitting a grant to purchase fire pagers and Hampton Township Fire Department has volunteered to submit a Regional Assistance to Firefighter Grant (AFG) which will cover the purchase of 272 fire pagers and 4 fire pager programmers (programming software is included as part of the purchase); and
WHEREAS,	The total cost of the grant is \$150,800 with a 10% match required in an amount anticipated to be \$13,709. Bay County 9-1-1 Central Dispatch has budget funds in 2018 for the purpose of funding the \$13,709, 10% match; Therefore, Be It
RESOLVED	That the Bay County Board of Commissioners authorizes payment of required matching funds for the Regional Assistance to Firefighter Grant (AFG) in the amount of \$13,709, monies to come from funds allocated in the 9-1-1 Central Dispatch 2018 budget for this purpose; budget adjustments specific to the match requirement funding, if required, are approved.

WHER	EAS.
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State and Federal natural resource agencies tracked migratory bird populations in the Great Lakes area beginning in the 1900's and annual bird counts documented that the number of Double-crested cormorants (cormorants) appeared to have peaked in the 1940s, with about 6,000 birds. By the mid-1970's there was concern over the decline of most migratory birds in the Great Lakes region due to the effects of contamination (i.e., DDT), and cormorant numbers were estimated to be less than 100 birds; and

WHEREAS,

Cormorants migrate from the Gulf of Mexico to the Great Lakes region for the breeding season, spending approximately 150 days along the coastal island areas such as provided by Saginaw Bay. The diet of cormorants is almost exclusively fish and they depend on their surrounding waters to sustain both the breeding adults and their young once they hatch. An adult cormorant will eat 1.3 pounds of fish each day; and

WHEREAS,

Throughout the 1980-1990's protections were afforded to migratory birds and their numbers began to increase, persistent chemicals were banned, and extensive environmental clean-up projects were undertaken. During this same period, state, federal and tribal fisheries managers instituted extensive fish stocking programs to restore a better balance to the Great Lakes food web; and

WHEREAS,

Today the Great Lakes supports several important fisheries including commercial, recreational, and tribal which are collectively valued at more than \$7 billion annually and support more than 75,000 jobs. Yellow perch in particular is a key staple of the cormorant diet but also the centerpiece of Michigan's recreational fishery, Friday dinner fish fry's and an important economic draw; and

WHEREAS,

Resource managers in the Great Lakes now estimate that cormorant numbers have peaked at about 115,000 breeding pair and at these numbers their fish consumption is estimated 77 million pounds each year. In conjunction there has also been a drastic decline in Yellow perch harvest from a high of 375,000 fish to just 695 fish by the year 2000. Bait shops, fishing resorts, and fishing related service industries declined or closed in some communities by up to 40%. And

WHEREAS,

In 1998 and again in 2003 the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service developed orders to allow for state level management of cormorant populations for the benefit of fish, and when implemented, the numbers of Yellow Perch and other game fish rebounded. However the orders were rescinded in 2016 by the U.S. District Court until the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service can reissue an Environmental Assessment to show the effect of the orders allowing lethal control on cormorant populations. In Saginaw Bay the effect of two years without any cormorant control was easily seen last summer when the sky was blackened by such high numbers of the distinctive birds flying low over the horizon in continuous unbroken miles and miles of long lines of cormorants; And

WHEREAS,

The State of Michigan has gone on record in support of U.S. House Bill 4429, for reinstating effective cormorant management, applied in the same collaboratively way that we use to protect our other natural resources, to support our important Great Lakes fisheries valued at more than \$7 billion annually and more than 75,000 jobs. THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED

That the Bay County Board of Commissioners hereby supports the "Cormorant Control Act" House Bill 4429 directing the reissuance of a rule relating to extension of the expiration dates for double-crested cormorant depredation orders.
