There are many individuals in Bay County deserving of recognition for their contributions to Bay County and one of these worthy individuals is Joseph H. Schultz, Sr., affectionately known as "Bud"

since his early youth; and

WHEREAS,

As the first child in his family to go to college securing a degree in pharmacy, Joseph H. Schultz, Sr. and his beloved late wife of 66 years, Mildred, opened Schultz Pharmacy, a business that prospered and selflessly served the Pinconning community for 50 years providing customers with service whenever called upon, day or night, weekday or weekend, to include delivery of medications at no charge when necessary; and

WHEREAS,

Among his many and varied accomplishments, Joseph H. Schultz, Sr. assisted in administering the polio vaccine to all Pinconning area residents in the 1960's; and

WHEREAS,

While the owner of Schultz Pharmacy, Joseph H. Schultz, Sr. also owned the Wharf Marina for 20

vears; and

WHEREAS.

Joseph H. Schultz, Sr. has dedicated his life to serving the Pinconning area in many ways including assisting in forming the first troop of Boy Scouts in Pinconning, serving as Scout Master, coaching Little League, a Lion's Club member, a Chamber member, member of the St. Michael's Building Committee, the Pinconning Bi-Centennial Committee and even teaching Chemistry at St. Michael's High School; and

WHEREAS.

In addition to the various organizations and committees he served on, Joseph H. Schultz, Sr. was involved in very important events and projects in the Pinconning community to include laboriously working with dedicated friends to develop Pinconning Park, aiding in the realization of a look-out tower at Pinconning Park and chairing the Pinconning Ice Carnival, a popular community event held on the ice off the shore of what is now Pinconning Park. Joseph H. Schultz, Sr. is the "Pinconning Park Historian" for grade school kids sponsored by the Rotary Club of Pinconning and Standish; and

WHEREAS,

Joseph H. Schultz, Sr. and his wife, Mildred, along with Bernard and Milly Myers, were instrumental in getting city water installed and running to people that lived east of the railroad track, a major accomplishment since prior to 1973-1974 everyone east of the tracks had to daily haul water for drinking, cooking, laundry and bathing; and

Joseph H. Schultz, Sr., who will be 95 on October 27th, is known as a "giver" to family, friends, and community and his lifetime of contributions must be acknowledged; Therefore, Be It

On April 17, 2019, Governor Gretchen Whitmer signed an Executive Order 2019-10 creating a Joint Task Force on Jail and Pretrial Incarceration; and

WHEREAS,

The purpose of the joint task force is to evaluate justice systems in Michigan and to craft recommendations for statewide policy regarding judicial system efficiency and effectiveness; and

WHEREAS

State and local leaders invited PEW Charitable Trusts (PEW) to provide technical assistance to the task force by collecting and analyzing criminal justice system data to be provided by local and state agencies; and

WHEREAS,

The Bay County Sheriff's Office has been selected by the task force to provide jail inmate data to PEW to assist with the task force's objectives and the Bay County Sheriff's Office is seeking the Bay County Board of Commissioner's approval to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with PEW; and

WHEREAS,

The MOU sets forth the parties' understanding regarding the protection of the data provided to PEW by the Bay County Sheriff's Office. The term of the MOU is eleven (11) months and may be renewed for an additional three (3) months; and

WHEREAS,

There would be no financial impact to the County; Therefore, Be It

RESOLVED

That the Bay County Board of Commissioners approves the Memorandum of Understanding between Bay County (Sheriff's Office) and The Pew Charitable Trusts (PEW) for a term of eleven (11) months with possible renewal for an additional three (3) months and authorizes the Chairman of the Board to execute said MOU on behalf of Bay County following Corporation Counsel review/approval.

BY: WHEREAS,	WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE (6/4/19) The annual review of the fee schedule for soil erosion and sedimentation control permits administered by the Drain Office has provided an opportunity to consider improvement to our current requirements; and
WHEREAS,	The Drain Commissioner is requesting the Board add a category to the schedule to adapt to trends in underground construction; and
WHEREAS,	The use of bore technology to install underground utilities continues to expand and, although there is a category for utilities disturbing soil, it is designed with open trenching and installation in mind; and
WHEREAS,	Bore technology uses bore pits and tunneling that does not disturb significant stretches of ground; it is difficult to justify charging permit fees for lengths of utility installation where no soil is disturbed; and
WHEREAS,	In an effort to address this, it is proposed that a category for bore pits be added to the fee schedule and a fee of \$25 per bore pit to go along with a general permit fee; and

WHEREAS,	With the new MIDC requirements that these attorneys get continuing legal education credits, etc., the Office of Assigned Counsel believes it would be a best business practice to have the outside attorneys sign agreements to be on the list that will ensure that they will carry insurance, get the continuing legal education required by the MIDC (that is reimbursed by the County using MIDC funds), etc.; and
WHEREAS,	The Office of Assigned Counsel is seeking authorization from the Board to have the Board Chair sign such Agreements, after review and approval by Corporation Counsel, mainly because this has been an ongoing process for years under the supervision of the Courts. Now that it has fallen under MIDC guidance and mandates and has been moved to an Act 139 Department, Office of Assigned Counsel wants to have these written agreements so it can exercise some type of quality control over the overflow attorneys in order to ensure that MIDC standards are being met; and

RESOLUTION TO COMMEMORATE JUNE 10, 2019, AS THE 100TH ANNIVERSARY OF MICHIGAN'S RATIFICATION OF THE 19TH AMENDMENT

BY:	COMMISSIONER TOM RYDER, 6 TH DISTRICT
Whereas,	Michigan was the one of the first three states to ratify the 19th Amendment, to provide suffrage to women; and
Whereas,	The introduction, passage, and ultimate ratification of the 19th Amendment were the culmination of decades of work and struggle by advocates; and
Whereas,	This tireless advocacy began in Michigan in 1846 when a woman named Ernestine Rose spoke to the Michigan legislature about the need for women's suffrage; and
Whereas,	Organized efforts to advocate for a vote on women's suffrage began with a petition drive in 1855; and
Whereas,	By 1866, the Michigan legislature considered its first bill to extend suffrage to women, but the measure was defeated by a single vote; and
Whereas,	Over the next fifty years, proposals to grant women the right to vote were considered numerous times by the legislature and Michigan voters, but each time the measures came up short; and
Whereas,	Leading these campaigns were organizations, including the Michigan State Suffrage Association and the Michigan Equal Suffrage Association, who held rallies and worked to educate others: and
Whereas,	Women from across Michigan with diverse backgrounds and political views persisted in their quest, persevering in the face of resistance; and
Whereas,	These Michigan women played an instrumental role in achieving women's suffrage both in Michigan and across the country; and
Whereas,	It took male allies to support women in their endeavor to vote, for it was sons, husbands, and fathers who ultimately heard the calls of women and took this historic vote on June 10, 1919; and
Whereas,	In August of the following year, the 19th Amendment was ratified by three-fourths of the states and officially became part of the Constitution of the United States; and
Whereas,	We thank the decades-long effort by women's rights activists, the daughters, granddaughters, and great- granddaughters of the women who fought so hard to vote, and made their voices heard at the polls for nearly 100 years; and
Whereas,	Most of the women who began asking for the right to vote never lived to see the enfranchisement of women; and
Whereas,	Women are now running for elected office in unprecedented numbers, following in the footsteps of these great suffragists; and
Whereas,	We honor those who have championed the movement to achieve economic, social, and political equality for women in Bay County and in the state of Michigan; Therefore Be It
Resolved	That the Bay County Board of Commissioners declares the month of June 2019 as Women's Voters' Rights Month in Bay County in commemoration of the passage of the Women's Voters' Rights Act on June 10th 1919: Be it Further

WHEREAS,	The public mental health system in Michigan is based on the Federal Community Mental Health Centers Act of 1963 and grounded in the Michigan Mental Health Code, Public Act 258 of 1974 which created a state and county partnership for community mental health and related Medicaid safety net services; and
WHEREAS,	This arrangement ensures that shared state and county mental health policy objectives are accountable to local communities and their elected representatives; and
WHEREAS,	This arrangement also ensures that resource and care decisions are ultimately accountable through board governance to the persons and families that need public mental health services; and
WHEREAS,	The proposed 298 pilot implementation severs the state and county partnership by transferring management of community mental health related Medicaid services to private managed care companies, several that are profit-oriented and are not incorporated in Michigan; and

WHEREAS,	The 298 pilots also will result in resource and care decisions that will be monetized by private interests with no governance accountability to the persons and families needing public mental health services; Therefore, Be It
