BY:	BAY COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS (6/13/17)

WHEREAS, For many years, Bay County veterans have successfully operated a Veterans Transportation program for Bay County veterans in need of transportation to and from medical appointments. This program has provided a valuable service to countless veterans without any means of transportation; and

WHEREAS, In the past, lift vehicles were donated by Bay Metropolitan Transit Authority (BMTA) and passenger vehicles were provided through the Bay County fleet inventory when (traditionally) the Sheriffs Office replaced vehicles within their inventory. Fortunately, vehicle repair and maintenance has been provided by Bay County staff, reducing the costs for these periodic repairs; and

WHEREAS, The lift vehicle within the Veterans' fleet is no longer mechanically sound and unable to provide reliable transportation for veterans who are wheelchair-bound. Vehicle donations from BMTA have been discontinued; and

WHEREAS, It is the desire of the Bay County Veterans Transportation program that a replacement lift cargo vehicle be purchased and, fortunately, when Bay Metro recently prepared their own RFP for vehicles, they included an option for an additional vehicle in order to assist us in compiling the specifications and to obtain the lowest possible price. The Bid Cost Form indicates the prices for two vehicles; and

WHEREAS, The Bay County Veterans Transportation program continues to operate smoothly and wishes to continue to provide this service to veterans needing transportation and, in order to do so, request that excess veteran millage funds be used to purchase a lift-vehicle from Mobility Transportation Services at the price provided in the attached quotation form at a cost not to exceed \$52,760. (Vehicle #1 is the first choice.. If that option is not available, Vehicle #2 would be the second choice); Therefore, Be It

RESOLVED That the Bay County Board of Commissioners approves use of excess veteran millage funds for the purchase of a lift-vehicle from Mobility Transportation Services at the quoted price at a cost not to exceed \$52,760 and if vehicle # 1, the vehicle of choice, is not available, authorization is granted to purchase vehicle # 2; Be It Further

RESOLVED That the Chairman of the Board is authorized to execute any documents, if required, on behalf of Bay County following legal review/approval; Be It Further

- WHEREAS, This matter involves a ruling by the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) under the Child Care Fund rules related to children who are removed from parental custody; and
- WHEREAS, MDHHS interprets the rule that if a child is removed from any location other than the parental home, the local funding unit, in this case Bay County, is fully responsible for any treatment, housing, rehabilitation going forward; and
- WHEREAS, In contrast, if the child is removed from the parental home, the costs are shared 50/50 between the local funding unit and the State of Michigan; and
- WHEREAS, A particular case in Bay County involves two children whose home life is dysfunctional at best. Both of them have transitioned thru other family member's houses including their grandparent's home. The children have issues ranging from drug use to stealing and other criminal activity. They were in essence homeless and were found living in an abandoned structure and placed in the Juvenile Home; and
- WHEREAS, When DHHS petitioned to remove the children from their parents' custody, they were residents of the Juvenile Home which according to their interpretation of the rule meant that Bay County was fully responsible; and
- WHEREAS, Since mid-October 2016 through the end of April, Bay County has paid \$63,518.90 for the youngest child and \$35,625.37 for the oldest child, a total of \$99,144.27. At this rate the annual expense will be greater than \$180,000 for these two children, ages 15 and 17 respectively; and
- WHEREAS, Probate Judge Miner learned that attorney Paula A. Aylward at Allegiant Legal, PC, recently filed and successfully won a similar case for Arenac County; and
- WHEREAS, The Court feels that Bay County needs to take a stand and challenge MDHHS interpretation of the rule in regards to this particular case; Therefore, Be It
- RESOLVED That the Bay County Board of Commissioners authorizes retention of Allegiant Legal, PC to represent Bay County in a potential challenge to the MDHHS interpretation of the Child Care Fund Rules and authorizes Corporation Counsel to sign a Retainer Agreement on behalf of Bay County following legal review/approval; Be It Further
- RESOLVED That required budget adjustments to fund said representation are approved.

## RESOLUTION

BY:	WAYS AND N	MEANS C	OMMITTEE (	6/6/17)
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- WHEREAS, During the check valve portion of the modernization project at the Law Enforcement Center, it was discovered that the lower seal on the hydraulic cylinder was leaking. The repair may be as simple as replacing the in-ground hydraulic jack along with a PVC liner to as extensive as removing the entire hydraulic cylinder assembly which includes jack hammering out the in-ground shaft; and
- WHEREAS, It is at a point where it may be better to replace the West elevator with a staircase.

  The Jail currently has three elevators, the primary and oldest being the Westinghouse and the two newer elevators on the East side of the building, which were added during the expansion; and
- WHEREAS, The request for the staircase is twofold, one it allows for a faster response to a Deputy or inmate in need, and two the cost savings of eliminating an aging elevator; and
- WHEREAS, Quotes have been received from three different companies, two of which quoted a repair; Otis at \$30,400.00 and Schindler at \$55,755.00. Kone quoted a complete removal and replace at \$87,848.00; and
- WHEREAS, It is recommended that an engineering study be conducted at a cost of approximately \$3,000.00, monies to come from Fund Balance; Therefore, Be It
- RESOLVED That the Bay County Board of Commissioners approves funding (\$3,000) for a feasibility and cost study for the removal and replacement of the elevator with a staircase in the existing shaft area, and also a study for adding a staircase to the East side of the elevator providing a repair to the existing elevator is in order; Be It Further
- RESOLVED That the Chairman of the Board is authorized to execute documents required for the engineering/cost study on behalf of Bay County; Be It Further
- RESOLVED That required budget adjustments are approved.
