WHEREAS,	The Court successfully migrated to a new Jury Management Software package earlier this year; and
WHEREAS,	The prior in-house system was a two-step process that involved mailing a questionnaire to prospective jurors, receive them back, process them and assemble qualified jurors in panels; and
WHEREAS,	Part of this process involved having the Jury Board review requests for non-service and this process happened quarterly, so the board met four or more times per year; and
WHEREAS,	Today it is a one-step process in that all jurors are summoned and are required to complete the questionnaire; the form can be mailed back or completed online; and
WHEREAS,	The jurors can choose a different two-week period or request a waiver for non-service online; and
WHEREAS,	Staff monitors the changes daily and processes them appropriately and, if no waiver is granted and they are a no-show, they are given a date and time to appear before the Judge to explain why they ignored the summons; and
WHEREAS,	The jurors are typically assigned a new period to serve and assessed a fine and some have even been incarcerated for their failure to serve; and
WHEREAS,	Michigan Compiled Laws, Act 236 of 1961, Section 600.1301 defines how members are appointed to the Jury Board. Section 600.1302 defines how Jury Board members are compensated; and
WHEREAS,	The Court is requesting consideration to change the current per diem and mileage paid for each meeting to an annual stipend of \$200 to cover Jury Board members attendance at all meetings held in a calendar year; and
WHEREAS,	Sufficient funds are budgeted and no further appropriation is required; Therefore, Be It
RESOLVED	That the Bay County Board of Commissioners approves the current Jury Board per diem and mileage paid for each meeting to an annual stipend of \$200 to cover Jury Board members attendance at all meetings held in a calendar year, said change to be implemented immediately; Be It Further

1. <u>PURPOSE</u>: Establishes written guidelines governing the process for providing services under the Handyperson Services program.

2. <u>AUTHORITY</u>: Bay County Board of Commissioners

3. <u>APPLICATION</u>: This policy applies to all Bay County residents age 60 years or better.

1. Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to provide written guidelines to govern the process for providing services under the Handyperson Services program.

2. The Department on Aging offers light household maintenance to those Bay County residents 60 years or better who qualify for such services. Examples of services that may be performed include but are not limited to: minor water leaks, window repair, installation of needed home safety items such as grab bars.

The staff members of the Handyperson Program are not licensed contractors, electricians, or plumbers. The Department on Aging (DOA) reserves the right to refuse any request that warrants a fully licensed contractor or a permit.

3. Limitations of services and services not provided under this program include but are not limited to:

Pest control and extermination will not be part of this service.

Clients shall not purchase major improvements to their home (new appliances, roofing, windows, sinks, lavatories, wall paper, etc.) with the expectation that the Handyperson Service can install new items.

No roof repairs to be completed by Handyperson.

No work that requires a permit will be completed by Handyperson.

No work will be done above the first story (i.e., no windows, exterior work done on two story homes).

No repairs to garages, with the exception of access doors (excluding garage door).

No wallpaper, paint, or other cosmetic improvements to a home.

No cleaning or servicing furnaces.

No work on gas dryers.

No lawn mowing, trimming shrubs, landscaping, snow or ice removal.

No full building of ramps or decks.

Worker Safety: If the setting poses any type of safety hazard to DOA staff, DOA reserves the right to deny the service request and/or terminate any work that may be in progress. Staff shall not be subject to any form of abusive language or behavior.

5. Fee's will be based on a sliding fee scale as approved in the annual budget by the Board of Commissioners.

WHEREAS,	The Saginaw Bay recreational fishery is one of our greatest local and national resource treasures; and
WHEREAS,	Recreational fishing across Michigan is responsible for over \$2 billion in direct economic expenditures, and directly supports more than 35,000 jobs; and
WHEREAS,	Michigan hosts more than 1.4 million recreational anglers annually, including 300,000 from out-of-state, which is the second only to Florida; and
WHEREAS,	Estimates conclude that recreational fishing in Saginaw Bay alone has a \$33 million yearly direct economic impact to our region; and
WHEREAS,	Michigan's recreational anglers contribute more than \$30 million to help manage fisheries resources through taxes on equipment, licenses, and excise fees each year; and
WHEREAS,	Recreational fishing is a critical piece of Bay County's and the region's economy; and
WHEREAS,	Thousands of recreational fishermen come to our area from across the state and country to fish on the Saginaw Bay, Saginaw River and throughout the Saginaw Bay watershed 12 months per year using local hotels, restaurants, retail establishments, marinas, gas stations and other facilities important to the local economy; and
WHEREAS,	The Saginaw Bay fishery - particularly that of perch and walleye represents more than 75% of Lake Huron's total recreational fishing participation according to Michigan Seagrant; and
WHEREAS,	Yellow perch, a key and historically important recreation species, are at historically low levels in Saginaw Bay; and
WHEREAS,	Saginaw Bay's walleye population is one of our state's and country's greatest restoration success stories. However, it is still not fully recovered at historical levels and is not providing "surplus" walleye that would indicate that a commercial fishery for them is viable or necessary; and
WHEREAS,	The Saginaw Bay smallmouth bass fishery has been recently ranked the 8 th best in the northeast United States by Bassmaster Magazine, the most widely read bass fishing periodical in the world; and
WHEREAS,	The Michigan Department of Natural Resources is supporting new legislation that would update commercial fishing regulations that would better protect and support our critical recreational fishery; and
WHEREAS,	House Bills 4567, 4568 and 4569 are currently being reviewed by the Michigan House of Representatives' Committee on Natural Resources and Outdoor Recreation which would update and codify language particularly regarding the commercial fishing industry that has been in place since 1929; and
WHEREAS,	These bills will: better define terminology; remove obsolete language; improve and modernize reporting requirements; fines fees and penalties; add a restitution component for violations and poaching; clarify authority; codify existing practices that have been developed through administrative rules and orders; update the commercial fishing fee structure; improve the ability to enforce law; align Michigan's statutes with the other Great Lakes states; codify fish species that are available for commercial and/or recreational harvest; establish an improved state model that can be used as background for upcoming negotiations with five tribes who are part to an existing, but soon to be rewritten, consent decree; and

WHEREAS,

These bills have the support of the Michigan Department of Natural Resources, the Michigan United Conservation Clubs, Trout Unlimited, the Michigan Charter Boat Association, the Saginaw Bay Walleye Club, and dozens of additional groups representing thousands of sportsmen and sportswomen across the state and country; Therefore, Be It
