WHEREAS.

On June 28th, 1894, Congress adopted "A Bill Making Labor Day a Legal Holiday" which stated "that the first Monday of September in each year, being the day celebrated and known as Labor's Holiday, is hereby made a legal public holiday;" and

WHEREAS,

The labor of our people is essential to drive and improve local, state, and national economies and that the citizens of our community make significant sacrifices in their lives in order to partake in their works of labor; and

WHEREAS,

The organization of labor and the activities of the Labor movement have resulted in significant improvements in the working conditions of all American workers through their work to establish 8-hour work days, 40 hour work weeks, overtime pay, minimum wages, unemployment insurance, worker's compensation, breaks during the work day including lunch breaks, child labor laws, wrongful termination laws, and countless other workplace improvements; and

WHEREAS,

Unions and the Labor movement continue to work to protect the above mentioned rights of workers and fight ongoing threats to working people including proposals that would weaken whistleblower protection laws, undermine the family medical leave act and pregnancy and parental leave laws, limit access to collective bargaining rights, stop the expansion and enforcement of the Equal Pay Acts, and eliminate the ability of workers to have a secure retirement through pensions; and

WHEREAS,

These protections and rights have had a significant impact on the emergence of a middle-class lifestyle and retirement for working people in our community and across the nation; and

WHEREAS,

Our Local Unions work to ensure job opportunities and training for the people of the region, fight the outsourcing of our local jobs and insourcing of non-local labor, and act as watchdogs ensuring safe workplaces for workers in our community; and

WHEREAS,

Local Unions make significant investments in our community through donations of both time and labor to help non-profit organizations and struggling families in our community; and

WHEREAS,

Every citizens deserves to be recognized for the labor they perform and the impact that work has on their lives, the lives of their families, and everyone in our community; and

WHEREAS,

The Bay County Board of Commissioners wishes to pay tribute to all workers and Unions, past and present, and honor their role in building Bay County from its founding in 1857 to the present; Therefore, Be It

RESOLVED

That the Bay County Board of Commissioners retroactively declares September 4, 2017, as Labor Day in Bay County.

- WHEREAS, Bay County, Michigan, is a political subdivision within the State of Michigan with an official Emergency Operations plan in compliance with Section 19 of the Emergency Management Act, Act 390, Public Acts of 1976, as amended; and
- WHEREAS, Bay County sustained severe losses of major proportions brought on by the June 22 23, 2017 flooding resulting in multiple roads washed out or damaged, hundreds of homes impacted and damaged, multiple sewer back-ups, and personal property lost or damaged; and
- WHEREAS, The County Board of Commissioners of Bay County certifies that the County Emergency Operations Plan was implemented at the onset of the disaster at 10:26 a.m. on June 23, 2017 and all applicable disaster relief forces identified therein were exhausted; and
- WHEREAS, As a direct result of the disaster, public damage and expenditures were extraordinary and place an unreasonably great financial burden on Bay County totaling in excess of \$100,000; Therefore, Be It
- RESOLVED That the Bay County Board of Commissioners requests the Governor authorize a grant to Bay County from the State Disaster Contingency Fund pursuant to Section 19, Act 390, Public Acts of 1976, as amended; Be It Further
- RESOLVED That Thomas M. Herek, Chair of the Bay County Board of Commissioners, is authorized to execute for and on behalf of Bay County the application for financial assistance and to provide to the State any information required for that purpose
- RESOLVED That the Chairman of the Board is authorized to execute, and submit electronically (if required), the grant application documents on behalf of Bay County following legal review/approval; Be It Further
- RESOLVED That the grant applicant/recipient departments are required to work simultaneously with the Finance Department whose staff will provide financial oversight of said grant; Be It Finally
- RESOLVED That required budget adjustments are approved.
