WHEREAS,	A perfectionist with a focus on accuracy and following the rules of law, WALT WOZNIAK began his public service career as the Bay City Clerk in 1968 and served in that capacity for 17 years before retiring in 1986 during which time he assisted many people and made many, many friends; and
WHEREAS,	WALT WOZNIAK's work extended far beyond City Hall with his involvement in the Easter Seal campaigns, service on the Bay Arenac Community Mental Health Board, Knights of Columbus, St. Stevens Council 4102, Society for Crippled Children and Adults, Society of St. Vincent de Paul, and St. James Catholic Church; he also served as President of the Michigan Municipal Clerk's Association; and
