WHEREAS,	Home should be a place of warmth, unconditional love, tranquility, and security, and for most of us, home and family can indeed be counted among our greatest blessings. Tragically, for many Americans, these are blessings that are tarnished by violence and fear; and
WHEREAS,	An average of 20 people in the United States experience intimate partner violence every minute; and
WHEREAS,	An average of 3 women are murdered by intimate partners in the United States every day and a person experiencing strangulation in a relationship is 7 times more likely to be murdered by their partner and, according to the American Psychological Association, the presence of a gun in a domestic violence situation increases the risk of homicide by 500%; and
WHEREAS,	Women are not the only targets; men, children, the elderly, family pets and responding law enforcement officers are counted among the victims and,
WHEREAS,	According to a study by Break the Silence, 2006, witnessing violence is the strongest risk factor in transmitting violent behavior from one generation to the next; and
WHEREAS,	Children exposed to violence are more likely to attempt suicide, abuse drugs and alcohol, run away from home, and be exposed to human trafficking; and
WHEREAS,	Nearly 21% of female high school students and 13% of male high school students report being physically or sexually abused by a dating partner; and
WHEREAS,	Young women between the ages of 16 and 24 experience the highest rate of intimate partner violence and sexual assault; and
WHEREAS,	Domestic Violence costs an estimated \$8.3 billion annually in medical care, mental health services, and lost productivity on the job; and
WHEREAS,	Domestic violence victims lose nearly 8 million days of paid work per year in the United States alone - the equivalent of 32,000 full-time jobs; and
WHEREAS,	Women, men and children living with domestic violence suffer higher rates of physical injuries, chronic health problems, depression, PTSD, attempted suicide, substance abuse, behavior problems for children, and homelessness: and
WHEREAS,	In an effort to end domestic violence and provide safety to victims, the Bay Area Women's Center offers free-of-charge services to victims and their families through emergency shelter, a 24 hour crisis-line, counseling, support groups, and advocacy and community education; Therefore, Be It
RESOLVED	That the Bay County Board of Commissioners, along with the Bay County Executive, proclaim the month of October as Domestic Violence Awareness Month in Bay County and urge our citizens to observe this month by becoming aware of the tragedy of domestic violence, supporting those who are working toward its end and participating in community efforts.

The Executive Director of the Michigan Association of Counties (MAC) has stated that

MAC is considering supporting a change to Michigan election law; and

WHEREAS,

This change in Michigan law would force candidates for the office of County Commissioner to run as a "non-partisan" candidate and would prohibit said candidates from disclosing their party affiliation on ballots provided to Michigan

voters; and

WHEREAS,

Preventing disclosure of a candidate's party affiliation needlessly restricts and censors information that Michigan voters have traditionally relied upon to help them

select a candidate who shares their values; and

WHEREAS,

The proposed change to Michigan election law is not needed as current Michigan law already permits County Commission candidates to withhold information about their party affiliation from being printed on ballots provided to Michigan voters; and

WHEREAS,

Under the current law, Commissioner Candidates are able to run for office without being affiliated with a political party and disclosing their affiliation, by running as an

independent candidate; Therefore, Be It

**RESOLVED** 

That the Bay County Board of Commissions hereby supports providing Michigan voters with full information about their candidates for County Commissioner, and hereby opposes forcing a candidate for County Commissioner to run as a "non-

partisan" candidate; Be It Further

**RESOLVED** 

That a copy of this resolution be forwarded to State Senator Kevin Daley, State Representatives Brian Elder and Annette Glenn, the Michigan Association of Counties, and all Michigan Counties within two weeks of adoption.

WHEREAS, The Bay County Board of Commissioners has the duty, in its October annual session, to do the following in accordance with 211.37 of the Michigan Property Tax Laws; and

WHEREAS, These requirements are as follows:

Sec. 37: The County Board of Commissioners, at its annual session in October in each year, shall ascertain and determine the amount of money to be raised for County purposes, which determination and apportionment shall be entered at large on its records. It shall also examine all certificates, statements, papers, and records submitted to it, showing the moneys to be raised in the several townships for school, highway, drain, township and other purposes. It shall hear and duly consider all objections made to raising any such moneys by any taxpayer to be affected thereto. If it shall appear to the Board that any certificate, statement, paper, or record is not properly certified, or that the same is in anyway defective, or that any proceeding to authorize the raising of any such moneys had not been had or is in anyway imperfect, the Board shall certify the same, and if the certificate, statement, paper, record, or proceeding can then be corrected, supplied or had, the Board shall authorize and require the defects or omissions of proceedings to be corrected, supplied, or had. It may refer any or all the certificates, statements, papers, records, and proceedings to the Prosecuting Attorney, whose duty it shall be to examine the same and without delay, report in writing his opinion to the Board. It shall direct that such of the several amounts of money proposed to be raised for township, school, highway, drain, and all other purposes as shall be authorized by law, be spread upon the assessment roll of the proper townships, wards and cities. Such action and direction shall be entered in full upon the records of the proceedings of the Board, and shall be final as to the levy and assessment of all such taxes, except when there is a change made in the equalization of any county by the Board or State Tax Commission upon appeal in the manner provided by law. The direction for spread of taxes shall be expressed in terms of millages to be spread against the taxable values of properties and shall not direct the raising of any specific amount of money. This section does not apply when Section 36(2) applies; and

WHEREAS, The Bay County Board of Commissioners has caused the above to be thoroughly checked for statutory requirements; Therefore, Be It
