WHEREAS,	Home should be a place of warmth, unconditional love, tranquility, and security, and for most of us, home and family can indeed be counted among our greatest blessings. Tragically, for many Americans, these are blessings that are tarnished by violence and fear; and
WHEREAS,	Every 9 seconds a woman in the United States is assaulted by an intimate partner; and
WHEREAS,	An average of 3 women are murdered by intimate partners in the United States every day and a person experiencing strangulation in a relationship is 7 times more likely to be murdered by their partner and, according to the American Psychological Association, the presence of a gun in a domestic violence situation increases the risk of homicide by 500%; and
WHEREAS,	Women are not the only targets; men, children, the elderly, family pets and responding law enforcement officers are counted among the victims and,
WHEREAS,	According to a study by Break the Silence, 2006, witnessing violence is the strongest risk factor in transmitting violent behavior from one generation to the next; and
WHEREAS,	Children exposed to violence are more likely to attempt suicide, abuse drugs and alcohol, run away from home, and be exposed to human trafficking; and
WHEREAS,	Nearly I in 5 teenage girls who have been in a relationship said a boyfriend threatened violence or self- harm if presented with a breakup; and
WHEREAS,	Young women between the ages of 16 and 24 experience the highest rate of intimate partner violence and sexual assault; and
WHEREAS,	Domestic Violence costs an estimated \$8.3 billion annually in medical care, mental health services, and lost productivity on the job; and
WHEREAS,	Domestic violence victims lose nearly 8 million days of paid work per year in the United States alone - the equivalent of 32,000 full-time jobs; and
WHEREAS,	Women, men and children living with domestic violence suffer higher rates of physical injuries, chronic health problems, depression, PTSD, attempted suicide, substance abuse, behavior problems for children,
WHEREAS,	and homelessness; and In an effort to end domestic violence and provide safety to victims, the Bay Area Women's Center offers free-of-charge services to victims and their families through emergency shelter, a 24 hour crisis-line, counseling, support groups, and advocacy and community education; Therefore, Be It

WHEREAS, The Prosecutor's Office is requesting funds in order to secure the services of an expert

witness regarding the re-sentencing of convicted murderer, Dominic Paul Burdis. Defendant Burdis is being resentenced because the U.S. Supreme Court has held that individuals who committed a murder prior to their 18th birthday, and who were sentenced to a mandatory life in prison without possibility of parole, are now entitled to

be re-sentenced. These cases are more commonly known as the Juvenile Lifer cases; and

WHEREAS, Based on various rulings by both the U.S. Supreme Court and our Michigan Supreme

Court, the re-sentencing of the Defendant will require a rather lengthy evidentiary hearing and will result in the Judge imposing either a term-of-years sentence or a life

without possibility of parole sentence. If the Judge imposes a term of years sentence,

then, pursuant to statute, the minimum sentence would be between 25-40 years, and the maximum sentence would be at least 60 years. Importantly, because the Defendant was

convicted in 1995, he is entitled to receive various credits for time served while in prison.

This means that if the judge decided to re-sentence the Defendant to a minimum of 25

years, the Defendant could be released shortly after the re-sentencing hearing is

concluded. And, according to a report completed by the Defendant's expert witness, one of the Defendant's possible plans upon release from prison is to live in Bay County; and

The murder for which the Defendant was convicted, and for which he will be re-

sentenced, was extremely heinous in nature. It involved the Defendant brutally and repeatedly bludgeoning and stabbing the victim to death. At the time of this murder,

Defendant was just a few short weeks away from turning 18 years old. Needless to say, the Prosecutor is seeking to have the original sentence of life without possibility of parole

reinstated; and

WHEREAS,

WHEREAS,

WHEREAS, In anticipation of his re-sentencing, Defendant filed a motion with the Court requesting funds to retain an expert witness of his choosing. The total amount requested by the

defendant for this expert witness was \$17,500.00. The Court had its Order sealed, so the Prosecutor can only speculate as to the amount of money which was given to the

Defendant; and

WHEREAS, The Prosecutor has located an expert that will review the entire case file including the

police investigation, prison records, evaluation by the Defendant's expert and other supporting documents. She will perform an evaluation of the Defendant and produce a report and is also willing to testify at the re-sentencing hearing. The amount of time that would be required to review the material and author the report is not known, because

this re-sentencing process is new and every case is different; and

WHEREAS, Defendant is currently housed in the Chippewa Correctional Facility in the Upper Peninsula of Michigan. The travel time for the expert would be approximately 5 hours

one way. At this time the Prosecutor is attempting to work with the MDOC (Michigan Department of Corrections) to make the Defendant more available. However, no

assurances have been given; and

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- WHEREAS, In October 2008, the Bay County Board of Commissioners amended the Delinquent tax Revolving Fund Policy increasing the reserve from 10% to 20% after the annual distribution to the tax units; and
- WHEREAS, As of July 1, 2018 the Delinquent Tax Revolving fund had \$1.4 million on hand following the annual disbursement to the tax units of \$5.9 million and before the 2018 budgeted transfer of \$1,230,000.00; and
- WHEREAS, Transfers to the general fund have been approximately the amount the fund has earned and the fund has not had to borrow since 1998; and
- WHEREAS, The Bay County Treasurer has provided the Ways and Means Committee a detailed annual review of the Delinquent Tax Revolving Fund and makes his recommendation based on that review, i.e. transferring \$1,200,000 in 2019 which is approximately the amount of net revenue in 2017; Therefore, Be It
- RESOLVED That the Bay County Board of Commissioners concurs with the recommendation of the Bay County Treasurer and authorizes a transfer of \$1,200,000 from the Delinquent Tax Revolving Fund to the County's General Fund in 2019.

- 4. Coordinate this Ordinance with other county or municipal ordinances.
- 5. Provide minimum standards and regulations for display of addresses.
- 6. Provide for the creation of a master record of addresses along with other information necessary to locate buildings on properties and to reserve addresses or address ranges for properties.
- 7. Provide for the enforcement of this Ordinance.
- 8. Provide for an appeal process of this Ordinance.

It is anticipated that the duties of an Address Authority Administrator must be filled. Some costs associated with the operations associated with the addressing ordinance would be recovered through the establishment of a fee to provide the service of issuing addresses; Therefore, Be It

It shall also examine all certificates, statements, papers, and records submitted to it, showing the moneys to be raised in the several townships for school, highway, drain, township and other purposes. It shall hear and duly consider all objections made to raising any such moneys by any taxpayer to be affected thereto. If it shall appear to the Board that any certificate, statement, paper, or record is not properly certified, or that the same is in anyway defective, or that any proceeding to authorize the raising of any such moneys had not been had or is in anyway imperfect, the Board shall certify the same, and if the certificate, statement, paper, record, or proceeding can then be corrected, supplied or had, the Board shall authorize and require the defects or omissions of proceedings to be corrected, supplied, or had. It may refer any or all the certificates, statements, papers, records, and proceedings to the Prosecuting Attorney, whose duty it shall be to examine the same and without delay, report in writing his opinion to the Board. It shall direct that such of the several amounts of money proposed to be raised for township, school, highway, drain, and all other purposes as shall be authorized by law, be spread upon the assessment roll of the proper townships, wards and cities. Such action and direction shall be entered in full upon the records of the proceedings of the Board, and shall be final as to the levy and assessment of all such taxes, except when there is a change made in the equalization of any county by the Board or State Tax Commission upon appeal in the manner provided by law. The direction for spread of taxes shall be expressed in terms of millages to be spread against the taxable values of properties and shall not direct the raising of any specific amount of money. This section does not apply when Section 36(2) applies; and

WHEREAS, The Bay County Board of Commissioners has caused the above to be thoroughly checked for statutory requirements; Therefore, Be It

Annual (FY-2019) Asset Management Funds which are used specifically for the required annual Asset Management performed on federal aid roads within Bay County. These funds are utilized by BCATS, the Bay County Road Commission, the City of Bay City, and the City of Essexville for staff time of these agencies spent completing PASER ratings on Federal Aid Roads (a state statutory requirement); and

WHEREAS,

The anticipated 2019 federal funding amounts for each program area are as follows: BCATS PL federal funding amount \$166,095; BMTA PL federal funding amount \$46,226 and; Asset Management funding amount \$21,100. Local match is provided through cash contributions from the City of Bay City, City of Essexville, Bay County Road Commission, and Bay Metropolitan Transportation Authority which are then allowable reimbursements to these agencies through the course of the UWP activities. Bay County indirect costs are included and are part of the covered expenses of this grant; Therefore, Be It
