WHEREAS,	Home should be a place of warmth, unconditional love, tranquility, and security, and for most of us, home and family can indeed be counted among our greatest blessings. Tragically, for many
	Americans, these are blessings that are tarnished by violence and fear; and
WHEREAS, WHEREAS,	Every 9 seconds a woman in the United States is assaulted by an intimate partner; and An average of 3 women are murdered by intimate partners in the United States every day and a person experiencing strangulation in a relationship is 7 times more likely to be murdered by their partner and, according to the American Pschological Association, the presence of a gun
WHEREAS,	in a domestic violence situation increases the risk of homicide by 500%; and According to the Bureau of Justice Statistics Crime Data Brief, Intimate Partner Violence, February 2003, women accounted for 85% of the victims of intimate partner violence, men for
	approximately 15%; and
WHEREAS,	Women are not the only targets; men, children, the elderly, family pets and responding law enforcement officers are counted among the victims and,
WHEREAS,	According to a study by Break the Silence, 2006, witnessing violence is the strongest risk factor in transmitting violent behavior from one generation to the next; and
WHEREAS,	According to the National Resource Center on Domestic Violence, approximately 23% of LGBTQ men and 50% of LGBTQ women experience abuse at the hands of their intimate partners; and
WHEREAS,	Domestic Violence costs an estimated \$8.3 billion annually in medical care, mental health services, and lost productivity on the job. Women, men and children living with domestic violence suffer higher rates of physical injuries, chronic health problems, depression, PTSD, attempted suicide, substance abuse, behavior problems for children, and homelessness. In an effort to end domestic violence and provide safety to victims, the Bay Area Women's Center offers free-of-charge services to victims and their families through emergency shelter, a 24 hour crisis-line, counseling, support groups, and advocacy; and
WHEREAS,	The theme of Domestic Violence Awareness Month 2017 is "A Community in Solidarity: Rising from the ashes of domestic violence"; Therefore, Be It
RESOLVED	That the Bay County Board of Commissioners, along with the Bay County Executive, proclaim the month of October as Domestic Violence Awareness Month in Bay County and urge our citizens to observe this month by becoming aware of the tragedy of domestic violence, supporting those who are working toward its end and participating in community efforts. WHEREAS,	Bay County, like many Counties across the State, is facing an unprecedented opioid epidemic; and
WHEREAS,	Many Bay County residents have died from lethal drug overdoses and the use and abuse of prescription opioids has cost the County in measurable terms including, but not limited to, self-insured medical costs, workers compensation costs, child care costs and first responder costs, as well as in immeasurable ways, such as loss of life, quality of family life, etc.; and
WHEREAS,	It is widely believed that one of the main drivers of this epidemic is drug manufacturers' deceptive marketing and sale of opioids to treat chronic pain; and
WHEREAS,	There may be an opportunity to not only recoup some of the County's measurable losses through litigation, but also an opportunity for the County to address the underlying opioid problems through crafting some form of injunctive or declarative relied through litigation; and
WHEREAS,	Bay County has been approached by representatives of the County Executives Association of America to become involved not only in an Opioid Task Force, but also to sign a retainer agreement to retain the services of a nationally recognized law firm to investigate and potentially file such legal action on behalf of Bay County; and
WHEREAS,	Any such case would be taken on a contingency basis only, so there would be no negative financial impact to the County other than some employee time dedicated to responding to potential discovery requests in any such litigation; the potential financial benefit, however, could be great not only in potential compensation for measurable losses, but also in addressing the cause and potential remedies for the epidemic thereby reducing future first responder costs, etc.; Therefore, Be It

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- WHEREAS, In October 2008, the Bay County Board of Commissioners amended the Delinquent tax Revolving Fund Policy increasing the reserve from 10% to 20% after the annual distribution to the tax units; and
- WHEREAS, As of July 1, 2017 the Delinquent Tax Revolving fund had \$2.4 million on hand following the annual disbursement to the tax units of \$6.1 million and before the 2017 budgeted transfer of \$1,950,000.00; and
- WHEREAS, Transfers to the general fund have been approximately the amount the fund has earned and the fund has not had to borrow since 1998; and
- WHEREAS, The Bay County Treasurer has provided the Ways and Means Committee a detailed annual review of the Delinquent Tax Revolving Fund and makes his recommendation based on that review, i.e. transferring \$1,200,000 in 2018 which is approximately the amount of net revenue in 2015; Therefore, Be It
- RESOLVED That the Bay County Board of Commissioners concurs with the recommendation of the Bay County Treasurer and authorizes a transfer of \$1,200,000 from the Delinquent Tax Revolving Fund to the County's General Fund in 2018.

A survey done with homeowners in 2013, indicated a sizable number lacked sufficient knowledge of proper maintenance and care including regular pumping and inspection of said systems; and
WHEREAS,	This project proposes to 1) Map all current known systems within the Kawkawlin River Watershed area into Fetch GIS. 2) Identify all occupied properties which do not have any records of septic systems. 3) Make site visits to all properties within the watershed where no records exist and locate the septic systems and enter them into Fetch GIS. 4) Identify and abate any failing systems. During the site visits, homeowners will be educated on the proper maintenance of their systems and any possible issues with their current system; and
WHEREAS,	\$150,000 of funding is available for this project with a 25% match required. The required match amount is expected to come from in-kind services. A portion of the grant will pay for labor within the Environmental Health Department and the other for GIS mapping services and outreach through U of M Flint; Therefore, Be It
