- BY: WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE (10/4/16) WHEREAS, In October 2008, the Bay County Board of Commissioners amended the Delinquent tax Revolving Fund Policy increasing the reserve from 10% to 20% after the annual distribution to the tax units; and WHEREAS, As of July I, 2016 the Delinquent Tax Revolving fund had \$2.5 million on hand following the annual disbursement to the tax units of \$6.2 million and before the 2016 budgeted transfer of \$1,200,000.00; and WHEREAS, Transfers to the general fund have been approximately the amount the fund has earned and the fund has not had to borrow since 1998; and WHEREAS, The Bay County Treasurer has provided the Ways and Means Committee a detailed annual review of the Delinquent Tax Revolving Fund and makes his recommendation based on that review, i.e. transferring \$1,200,000 in 2017 which is approximately the amount of net revenue in 2015; Therefore, Be It RESOLVED That the Bay County Board of Commissioners concurs with the

WHEREAS,	The projected 2020 one year revenue (from the "department") under this Grant is \$155,318.46, the match amount from the County ("Contractor") is \$80,012.54. This reimbursement amount represents an increase from 2019 of \$7,396.62; and
WHEREAS,	The projected 2021 one year revenue (from the "department") under this Grant is \$163,084.02, the match amount from the County ("Contractor") is \$84,012.98. This reimbursement amount represents an increase from 2020 of \$7,765.56; Therefore, Be It

WHEREAS, The following grants support the activities of the Transportation Planning Division which maintains a certified planning program according to federal regulations. The Bay City Area Transportation Study (BCATS) activities are provided in the proposed 2017 Unified Work Program; and

WHEREAS, The BCATS funded program is required in order to utilize federal funds for road construction projects in the Bay City Urbanized Area. Annual (FY-2017) Project Authorization for the Utilization of Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) Planning Funds (PL) passed through to Bay County (BCATS) by the Michigan Department of Transportation are used to fund the planning activities of the BCATS staff. PL funds are also used for transit planning activities which are passed through Bay County to Bay Metropolitan Transportation Authority (BMTA); and

WHEREAS, Annual (FY-2017) Asset Management Funds which are used specifically for the required annual Asset Management performed on federal aid roads within Bay County. These funds are utilized by BCATS, the Bay County Road Commission, the City of Bay City, and the City of Essexville for staff time of these agencies spent completing PASER ratings on Federal Aid Roads (a state statutory requirement); and

WHEREAS, The anticipated 2017 federal funding amounts for each program area are as follows: BCATS PL federal funding amount \$159,645; BMTA PL federal funding amount \$40,723 and; Asset Management funding amount \$20,000. Local match is provided through cash contributions from the City of Bay City, City of Essexville, Bay County Road Commission, and Bay Metropolitan Transportation Authority which are then allowable reimbursements to these agencies through the course of the UWP activities. Bay County indirect costs are included and are part of the covered expenses of this grant; Therefore, Be It

RESOLVED That the Bay County Board of Commissioners approves the Project Authorizations and authorizes the Chairman of the Board, on behalf of Bay County, to execute said forms and all contracts and documents required to implement the BCATS 2016 Unified Work Program following legal review/approval; Be It Further

WHEREAS,	The Concession Stand at the Civic Arena currently sells frozen carbonated beverages, better known as Icees and, due to their popularity, more icees are sold at the concession stand than fountain pop; and
WHEREAS,	Currently, the company allows us to use their machine at no cost if we purchase their products, such as syrup, however, if we purchase our own frozen carbonated beverage machine, we can purchase the syrup for the machine from a different vendor at a significantly reduced cost to save money in the long run; and
WHEREAS,	The Civic Arena sold 4,197 icees in 2015 and, based on the amount of syrup purchased for those sales compared to purchasing the same amount of syrup for another vendor at a significantly reduced cost, there is a profit difference of almost \$3,000 per year; and
WHEREAS,	If a machine is purchased for the Civic Arena, the syrup savings alone would pay for the new machine in 4-5 years when the machine has a life span of 10 years or more. Profits would pay for the machine in about 2 years and staff will also explore the option of a refurbished machine, if available and reliable; and
WHEREAS,	The funds for this equipment is not budgeted; therefore, a budget adjustment of up to \$13,000 is necessary from the general fund; Therefore, Be It
RESOLVED	That the Bay County Board of Commissioners authorizes the purchase of a frozen carbonated beverage machine at the Bay County Civic Arena and appropriates up to \$13,000 for said purchase, monies to come from Fund Balance; Be It Further
RESOLVED	That the Chairman of the Board is authorized to execute any documents required for acquisition of this equipment on behalf of Bay County following legal review/approval; Be It Finally
RESOLVED	That related, required budget adjustments are approved.

WHEREAS,	A high quality viewing scope along the shore line at Pinconning Park would fit the Bay Area Community Foundation's focus area of improving public awareness of the Saginaw Bay; and
WHEREAS,	The Director of Recreation and Facilities wishes to apply for funding for a viewing scope that would attach to the concrete boardwalk along the open shore line / beach area just north of the gazebo; and
WHEREAS,	The viewing scope is the 7100 Mark II Non Coin Operated Viewing Scope and it has 10x viewing capability and is virtually non-destructible; and
