WHEREAS,	Roughly 8,400 veterans reside in Bay County which is about 10% of the adult population, and, as a result, Bay County has one of the highest number of veterans per capita in the State of Michigan; and
WHEREAS,	The Soldiers & Sailors Relief Commission (SSRC) (previously Bay County's Office of Veterans Affairs) offers assistance to honorably discharged, indigent veterans and their families and the various services offered include support, emergency relief and assistance in applying for VA Benefits; and
WHEREAS,	The SSRC, a three person commission appointed by the probate court judge that meet and oversee policies as well as expenses, utilizes a millage that generates around \$295,000 a year and the Director of Administrative Services oversees administrative responsibilities; and
WHEREAS,	With the recent resignation of one member of the three member commission, a cooperative review of the SSRC and its role relating to the needs of Bay County Veterans was made by Corporation Counsel, Director of Administrative Services, and the County Executive; and
WHEREAS,	As a result, it has been determined that a Department of Veterans Affairs is warranted as an autonomous Act 139 Department, rather than an division within the Administrative Services Department and the County Executive would assign a current Director to oversee the newly created Department; and
WHEREAS,	Counties that have their own Department of Veterans Affairs are given priority for state funded grants; and
WHEREAS,	With the creation of the Department of Veterans Affairs, a committee of 3-7 veterans would be appointed by the Bay County Board of Commissioners to guide policy and make material determinations with the Department Director providing administrative oversight and support; and
WHEREAS,	There is no financial or economic impact to the General Fund, as the Department would be funded with millage dollars; County; Therefore, Be It
RESOLVED	That the Bay County Board of Commissioners, following a public hearing to be held December 11, 2018, approves the following:
43	Description of Material Affairs shall be designed as Act 120 Description of the Boy County

- 1) The Department of Veterans Affairs shall be designated an Act 139 Department (the Bay County Department of Veterans Affairs) from a Division of the Administrative Services Department (Soldiers and Sailors Relief Commission) under the authority of the County Executive following a public hearing by MCL 45.564 (a) and (b), and pursuant to MCL 35.621 to 35.624;
