Call to Order:

The BCATS Policy Committee Meeting was called to order at 1:32 p.m.

Agenda Approval:

Laura Ogar requested to add an item; a Resolution of Support, to submit the Reaffirmation letter for the Long-Range Transportation Plan (LRTP). Lillo said it would be appropriate to add under Other/New Business. It was moved by Lillo, seconded by Sprague, to add the item under Other and motion passed unanimously. Ogar motioned to approve the agenda with the addition, Sprague seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

Public Comment:

Legislative Update:

There was a discussion that MDOT is hearing from Washington DC that state and federal project submissions may need to be split between the FHWA and FTA, due to required federal legal review. For the time being pending jobs can't move forward. Any DEI must be removed and any EV related projects not obligated already are gone.

Agency Reports:

Bay City reports that Projects in the City are moving forward but slowly. Bay County Road Commission (BCRC) reports that Cory Wale, PE with the Bay County Road Commission was recognized as the Urban Engineer of the Year for the state of Michigan by CRA. Unanimous discussion that it was well deserved. Bay Metro Transit Authority (BMTA) reports that they have a new app to track the buses' location while on route in real time. The app is available through the app store.
