	grant-funded, service, where the State reimburses 66%, and the County is responsible for the balance; and
WHEREAS,	The proposed Consulting Services Agreement between MGT and the Bay County Friend of the Court covers services as set forth in the attachment email from Donna Smigiel of MGT; and
WHEREAS,	Since 2013, there has been a fixed annual cost contract with MGT of \$6,400.00 per year, plus \$1.40 per time sheet processed fee, paid quarterly; and
WHEREAS,	Because of the changes and new requirements, MGT's responsibilities have steadily increased and new yearly rate will be \$8,000.00, a base rate change of \$1,600.00 per year, attachment details the increase in cost to the County as \$60.29 per month; and
WHEREAS,	The Friend of the Court receives 66% reimbursement of all qualified expenses from the Cooperative Reimbursement Grant. In addition, the Friend of the Court receives quarterly incentive payments which are based upon the collection of support through the Michigan Child Support Enforcement System. The Friend of the Court is confident that this new search tool will help to increase yearly collections; thereby increasing our quarterly incentive payments; Therefore, Be It

WHEREAS,	More than 10 years ago on November 1, 2010, Bay County entered into an Agreement for Services with Bay Future, Inc., a Michigan Non-Profit Corporation ("Bay Future") for Bay Future to provide services related to
WHEREAS,	economic development; and The term of the Agreement was for a three (3) year period, with a provision that Bay Future could at its
WHEREAS,	discretion continue to provide services on a month—to-month basis; and The County has not entered into a new Agreement with Bay Future, but has rather continued in accordance with the expired Agreement to pay Bay Future in one lump sum for services rendered on an annual basis. Pursuant to the Agreement, there is no dollar amount set for reimbursement other than a "cap" on compensation "not to exceed \$50,000" and Bay County has historically paid that amount every year for the past ten (10) years; and
WHEREAS	As the Board is aware, Congress passed the \$1.9 Trillion American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 ("ARPA") under which Bay County is anticipating receiving approximately \$20 million over the next 3 year period; and
WHEREAS,	This ARPA money is meant, in great part, to be targeted toward economic relief for businesses and recovery of the local economy. Bay Future has previously dispersed block development grant funds and other forms of funding to local area businesses in the form of economic relief, and has staff trained and available to continue their application, vetting, evaluation and award process; and
WHEREAS,	Should Bay County determine that a possible portion of the ARPA funds it receives be targeted toward and dispersed to any local businesses, Bay Future would potentially be the County's best option to vet and administer the distribution of those funds, saving both County staff time and expense; however, based on the compensation "cap" language of the current (expired) Agreement, Bay County would not be able to utilize Bay Future for this purpose; and
WHEREAS,	It is a best business practice to renew written Agreements upon their expiration rather than continue payment on a month-to-month basis of expired Agreements and the Bay County Executive requests that the Board enter into a renewed three (3) year Agreement with Bay Future with an automatic extension clause for an additional three (3) year Agreement with Bay Future to be automatically extended for an additional three (3) year period absent notice either party of an intent not to renew, and, further, that the \$50,000 compensation "cap" included in the expired Agreement be removed; and
WHEREAS,	This would allow the County to budget for the standard \$50,000 as base compensation paid to Bay Future as has been paid in past years, but allows the Board to contribute additional amounts under the Agreement should the Board choose to do so; and
WHEREAS,	This would not require any additional contribution by the Board over and above the current contribution, but would simply give the County discretion to contribute additional amounts without violating any existing written Agreement should it so choose over the course of the renewed Agreement; and
WHEREAS,	The renewal and Amendment of the Agreement would have no impact on the General Fund (absent affirmative action by the County to transfer or pay additional funds to Bay Future at the County's discretion); Therefore, Be It
