WHEREAS,	On January 18, 2022, the Bay County Board of Commissioners adopted Resolution No. 2022-14, which authorized the County to enter into an agreement with the Bay Area Community Foundation (BACF); and
WHEREAS,	The agreement would provide the Foundation with \$750,000 in ARPA funds to provide grant funds to nonprofit organizations that have been negatively impacted by COVID-19 and \$37,500 in administrative costs; and
WHEREAS,	The Foundation has expressed some concern that it lacks the knowledge and expertise interpreting and applying the voluminous amount of ARPA regulations released by the U.S. government to make informed decisions on questions presented by nonprofit organizations when applying for the grant funding and, in addition, the Foundation may need sonic technical assistance when evaluating the grant applications; and
WHEREAS,	The Foundation is requesting to use a portion of the \$750,000 that is to be given as grants to nonprofits to hire professionals schooled in ARPA to provide technical assistance to nonprofit organizations when applying for grants; and, if necessary, to provide assistance to the Foundation when administering the grant funds; and
WHEREAS,	As the number of nonprofits that may take advantage of the technical assistance is unknown, there is no fixed dollar amount associated with this request; and
WHEREAS,	The Foundation is requesting to reduce the \$750,000 to be given to nonprofit organizations by the actual costs of the professionals hired that are schooled in ARPA that will provide the technical assistance to the nonprofit organizations applying for grants and to the Foundation when administering the funds; Therefore, Be It
RESOLVED	That the Bay County Board of Commissioners hereby amends Resolution No. 2022- 14 to allow the Bay Area Community Foundation to hire professionals schooled in ARPA to provide technical assistance to nonprofit organizations applying for grants; and if necessary, to the Foundation administering the grant funds up to \$25,000; Be It Further
