BY: WHEREAS,	WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE (11/12/14) The portion of the Child Care Fund Budget which funds the placement of neglected and abused as well as delinquents is underfunded for the current fiscal year of 2014 due to the increased number of neglected and abuse children in the justice system and due to the high cost of placing these children; and											
WHEREAS,	While the Court had done its best to minimize the cost of such placements by placing children with relatives and/or utilizing community or court programs to service the needs of the youth who fall under the jurisdiction of the court, however, the current budget will not meet the costs of placing these youth; due to qualification requirements, Title IV-E funding is no longer available to pay for the placement of children and this cost has been shifted from the federal/state government to state/local government; and											
WHEREAS,	It is estimated that the Child Care Fund will face a deficit of up to \$150,000 by year end and since that amount is split 50/50 between state and county, Bay County's portion would be up to \$75,000; and

 - 4. At the next Board meeting, following publication of proper notice, the Board may vote for final passage of the proposed ordinance or amendment by majority vote
- WHEREAS, An alternative process is also provided for in the Board Rules whereby the Board can elect to suspend Article XIII by a 2/3rds majority vote, bypass the requirements (1 through 4 above) and vote on the Ordinance or Ordinance Amendment before them; Therefore, Be It
- RESOLVED By the Bay County Board of Commissioners that, for the sake of expediency, Article XIII of the Rules of the Bay County Board of Commissioners is hereby suspended for the adoption of Amendments to the Bay County Employees' Retirement Ordinance.
