Attached you will find the County At-large Assessments for drain projects this year. The total is \$116,329.67. We continue to attempt to minimize the County At-Large Assessments in an effort to reduce the burden on the general fund but have been very active in our work.

I must note that most assessments, however, are "Operation and Maintenance". Under the Drain Code, these project figures are determined by the "historical percentages" set by the last petitioned project for that particular drain. Our ability to alter these is very limited.

As you will note from the list, we have had a productive year in upgrading the County's drain system. We attempted to address the many requests we received during the last year. We have taken advantage of our internal staff, good pricing from contractors and close working relationships with townships to complete the work affordably as possible. It reflects the skill and hard work of the staff we have in the Office of the Drain Commissioner.

I am aware of the difficult job you have with respect to the County budget and wanted to assure you our office is doing what it can to reduce our burden on it. Please do not hesitate to contact me with questions.

WHEREAS,	In 2022, Bay County, as well as the rest of the state of Michigan, saw some of the highest population densities of Gypsy (Spongy) Moth since the early to mid-1990s largely due to changing weather conditions which allowed Gypsy (Spongy) Moth populations to thrive and which suppressed the naturally occurring biological controls that kept populations in check; and
WHEREAS,	On May 24, 2022, the Program treated nearly 4,000 acres of Infested woodlots in six different townships throughout Bay County to control these rising populations and post-treatment monitoring reported a reduction of 75% or more in the numbers of feeding Gypsy (Spongy) Moth caterpillars, assuring that aerial treatment successfully met performance targets; and
WHEREAS,	Landowner reports show that Gypsy (Spongy) Moth populations continue to build in new areas throughout Bay County and that treatment will again be needed in the spring of 2023; and
WHEREAS,	Bay County's contract with Al's Aerial Spraying, LLC expired following Gypsy (Spongy) Moth treatment in May of 2022 (this contract was an extension of the initial contract which originated in 2019); and
WHEREAS,	Al's Aerial Spraying, LLC proposed a renewal or extension of the current contract for the 2023 and 2024 treatment seasons under the same terms, price, and conditions of the previous extension; and
WHEREAS,	Due to major increases in the costs of items such as fuel and products used for treatment purposes, extending the contract is a way for the Program to ensure lower treatment costs; and
WHEREAS,	The Gypsy Moth Suppression Program administration feels it's important to secure Bay County's aerial applicator for the 2023 and 2024 aerial treatment seasons due to the high demand for aerial applicators resulting from the increase in Gypsy Moth populations throughout Michigan; waiting may result in Bay County's inability to secure an aerial applicator for spring treatment; and
WHEREAS,	Extending the current contract under the same terms and conditions ensures treatment costs will remain at \$51.56 per acre, a price first established in the initial contract with Al's Aerial Spraying, LLC.; no General Funds are required; and

9-1-1 Central Dispatch lost power on September 21, 2022 after a nearby lightning strike and while traditionally 9-1-1's diesel generator starts within 1-2 minutes and supplies the necessary power to continue operations at 9-1-1, on this day the generator did not start resulting in a catastrophic failure for the 9-1-1 Central Dispatch Center; and

WHEREAS, For approximately 20-30 minutes incoming calls were routed to Midland County and dispatchers were using portable handheld radios; all information was being handwritten due to computers, phones, or radio consoles also being down; and

WHEREAS,
9-1-1 Central Dispatch staff was shuffled to the Backup Center in Bangor Township where
Dispatchers would manually write calls for the first 3 hours and continue to work for the next 16 hours until the power was restored; and

WHEREAS, The backup generator has been non-functioning since 2021, however, the cost of replacement has been too high and other generator orders for Bay County have taken too long to receive; and

WHEREAS, Currently, there is no functioning generator at all; and

WHEREAS, It has been determined that replacing both the main generator (recent fail), and the backup generator (which was already non-functioning and in need of replacement) is the ideal long-term solution: and

It may refer any or all the certificates, statements, papers, records, and proceedings to the Prosecuting Attorney, whose duty it shall be to examine the same and without delay, report in writing his opinion to the Board. It shall direct that such of the several amounts of money proposed to be raised for township, school, highway, drain, and all other purposes as shall be authorized by law, be spread upon the assessment roll of the proper townships, Such action and direction shall be entered in full upon the wards and cities. records of the proceedings of the Board and shall be final as to the levy and assessment of all such taxes, except when there is a change made in the equalization of any county by the Board or State Tax Commission upon appeal in the manner provided by law. The direction for spread of taxes shall be expressed in terms of millages to be spread against the taxable values of properties and shall not direct the raising of any specific amount of money. This section does not apply when Section 36(2) applies; and
