	who had none; and
WHEREAS,	According to witnesses who survived the attack, the four chaplains linked arms, sang hymns, and offered prayers as they went down with their ship; and
WHEREAS,	More than 600 members of our nation's military tragically passed away that day,
	including the four chaplains, making it known as the second-worst sea disaster of WWII; and
WHEREAS,	Congress attempted to confer the Medal of Honor on the Chaplains but was prevented by strict guidelines; and
WHEREAS,	Instead, Congress authorized a one-time posthumous Special Medal for Heroism
	given by former President Eisenhower in 1961 with the intention of having the
	same weight and importance as the Medal of Honor; Therefore, Be It

BACKGROUND:

Bay County Department on Aging is an established Meals on Wheels partner with Meals on Wheels of America. We will be working in collaboration with the County's Veteran Affairs Department to apply for a grant of \$25,000 to assist homebound Veterans with some home modification such as Handrail repair/installation, grab bar installation, no-step thresholds etc.

FINANCE and ECONOMICS:

This is a \$25,000 grant that will be announced on February 13, 2023 by Meals on Wheels and needs to be used by December 31, 2023. There is no cost to Department on Aging to apply.
