WHEREAS,	9-1-1 Central Dispatch has also partnered with several other agencies and departments in an effort to increase the number of Bay Alerts subscribers and allow partners to issue interagency notifications. Over the past 12 months, 9-1-1 has sent approximately 13 million individual messages with Bay Alerts; and
WHEREAS,	While other vendors have the same features as Rave, the process of changing mass notification vendors requires an entire rebuild of 73 individual "Lists" that subscribers are divided into. Other hurdles with switching vendors would include retraining all partner users of the systems and launching a new marketing campaign to get Bay County residents to sign up; and
WHEREAS,	Other systems are given a cursory review yearly to make sure a product is not released with a new feature that would be worth switching to, and while they are capable of meeting the objectives, the added time and cost of a complete rebuild of the system is prohibitive; and
WHEREAS,	As such, Rave Mobile Safety has been approved by Finance and Purchasing as a sole source vendor. Due to the sole source status, it is being requested to enter into a three (3) year Agreement with Rave Mobile Safety to secure a lower year-to-year cost, and pay the current year's annual cost of \$21,195.08; and
