VOTE ABSENTEE BY MAIL OR DROP-OFF

- A voter must submit an absentee ballot application to their local clerk before an absentee ballot can be sent (unless they are on the permanent absentee ballot list).
- Return your ballot by mail, drop box, or inperson to your local clerk's office.

You can also sign up to receive electronic notification on ballot status at <u>michigan.gov/vote</u>

Permanent Absentee Ballot List

Voters who are on the permanent mail ballot list will automatically receive an absentee ballot from their local clerk for all upcoming elections. You are not required to submit another application in order to receive a ballot.

Voter is responsible for updating any temporary mailing address with the local clerk's office. Ballots cannot be forwarded by the post office.




VOTE EARLY IN-PERSON

LOCATION - Bay County Community Center 800 JFK Dr. Bay City, MI 48706

TIME - 8:30 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.

DAYS - Begins the second Saturday prior to Election Day and ends the Sunday before an election.

Early Voting will <u>only</u> be available for the regular August and November elections





VOTE ON ELECTION DAY IN-PERSON

- Polls are open 7:00 a.m. 8:00 p.m.
- Contact your local clerk for your polling location or check mi.gov/vote
- Voted absentee ballots can be returned and tabulated at your election day precinct.

Need assistance marking your ballot?

Ask the election inspectors at your precinct to use the Voter

Assist Terminal to help mark your ballot.

Voter Registration

- Those who have a valid Michigan Driver's License or State ID, can register at mi.gov/vote
- Register by mail or in-person at the clerk's office.

Deadlines

- Online or by mail: up to 15 days before an election.
- <u>In-person at your local clerk's office:</u> through election day. Proof of residency required during last 14 days before election day.
