PROPOSAL 12-1 A REFERENDUM ON PUBLIC ACT 4 OF 2011 - THE EMERGENCY MANAGER LAW Public Act 4 of 2011 would:

 Establish criteria to assess the financial condition of local government units, including school districts.

 Authorize Governor to appoint an emergency manager (EM) upon state finding of a financial emergency, and allow the EM to act in place of local government officials.

 Require EM to develop financial and operating plans, which may include modification or termination of contracts, reorganization of government, and determination of expenditures, services, and use of assets until the emergency is resolved.

 Alternatively, authorize state-appointed review team to enter into a local government approved consent decree.

Should this law be approved?

PROPOSAL 12-4 A PROPOSAL TO AMEND THE STATE CONSTITUTION TO ESTABLISH THE MICHIGAN QUALITY HOME CARE COUNCIL AND PROVIDE COLLECTIVE BARGAINING FOR IN-HOME CARE WORKERS

This proposal would:

- Allow in-home care workers to bargain collectively with the Michigan Quality Home Care Council (MQHCC). Continue the current exclusive representative of in-home care workers until modified in accordance with labor laws.
- Require MQHCC to provide training for in-home care workers, create a registry of workers who pass background checks, and provide financial services to patients to manage the cost of in-home care.

 Preserve patients' rights to hire in-home care workers who are not referred from the MQHCC registry who are bargaining unit members.

 Authorize the MQHCC to set minimum compensation standards and terms and conditions of employment.

Should this proposal be approved?

SENIOR CITIZENS MILLAGE PROPOSAL

"Shall the limitation on the amount of property taxes which may be levied each year against all taxable real and personal property in the County of Bay be increased by not more than .3 of a mill (30¢ per \$1,000 of taxable value) for a period of 5 years, 2012-2016 inclusive, for senior citizens' programs and related facilities?" This new millage will raise estimated revenues of \$870,590.37 in the first year of the levy.

PROPOSAL 12-2 A PROPOSAL TO AMEND THE STATE CONSTITUTION REGARDING COLLECTIVE BARGAINING

This proposal would:

 Grant public and private employees the constitutional right to organize and bargain collectively through labor unions.

 Invalidate existing or future state or local laws that limit the ability to join unions and bargain collectively, and to negotiate and enforce collective bargaining agreements, including employees' financial support of their labor unions. Laws may be enacted to prohibit public employees from striking.

 Override state laws that regulate hours and conditions of employment to the extent that those laws conflict with collective bargaining agreements.

 Define "employer" as a person or entity employing one or more employees.

Should this proposal be approved?

PROPOSAL 12-5 A PROPOSAL TO AMEND THE STATE CONSTITUTION TO LIMIT THE ENACTMENT OF NEW TAXES BY STATE GOVERNMENT

This proposal would:

Require a 2/3 majority vote of the State House and the State Senate, or a statewide vote of the people at a November election, in order for the State of Michigan to impose new or additional taxes on taxpayers or expand the base of taxation or increasing the rate of taxation.

This section shall in no way be construed to limit or modify tax limitations otherwise created in this Constitution.

Should this proposal be approved?

BAY MEDICAL CARE FACILITY MILLAGE PROPOSAL

This proposal would replace previous medical care facility millage which expired with the 2011 tax levy.

"Shall the limitation of the amount of property taxes which may be assessed each year against all real and personal property in Bay County be increased by not more than .75 of a mill (75 cents per \$1,000) for a period of 5 years, December 1, 2012 to November 30, 2017 inclusive, for the operation, maintenance and capital costs of the Bay Medical Care Facility?" (This millage will raise estimated revenues of \$2,187,485.61 in the first year of the levy.)

PROPOSAL 12-3 A PROPOSAL TO AMEND THE STATE CONSTITUTION TO ESTABLISH A STANDARD FOR RENEWABLE ENERGY

This proposal would:

- Require electric utilities to provide at least 25% of their annual retail sales of electricity from renewable energy sources, which are wind, solar, biomass, and hydropower, by 2025.
- Limit to not more than 1% per year electric utility rate increases charged to consumers only to achieve compliance with the renewable energy standard.
- Allow annual extensions of the deadline to meet the 25% standard in order to prevent rate increases over the 1% limit.
- Require the legislature to enact additional laws to encourage the use of Michigan made equipment and employment of Michigan residents.

Should this proposal be approved?

PROPOSAL 12-6 A PROPOSAL TO AMEND THE STATE CONSTITUTION REGARDING CONSTRUCTION OF INTERNATIONAL BRIDGES AND TUNNELS

This proposal would:

 Require the approval of a majority of voters at a statewide election and in each municipality where "new international bridges or tunnels for motor vehicles" are to be located before the State of Michigan may expend state funds or resources for acquiring land, designing, soliciting bids for, constructing, financing, or promoting new international bridges or tunnels.

 Create a definition of "new international bridges or tunnels for motor vehicles" that means, "any bridge or tunnel which is not open to the public and serving traffic as of

January 1, 2012."

Should this proposal be approved?

HISTORICAL PRESERVATION MILLAGE PROPOSAL

This is a continuation of the original .1 of a mill previously approved by the voters. "Shall the limitation of the amount of property taxes which may be assessed each year against all real and personal property in the County of Bay be increased by not more than .1 of a mill (10¢ per \$1,000) for a period of 20 years, 2014-2033 inclusive, to be used to preserve Bay County's unique history, educate citizens, conduct projects, and operate and maintain a museum?" This millage will raise estimated revenues of \$250,000 in the first year of the levy.

KAWKAWLIN TOWNSHIP ROAD MILLAGE PROPOSAL

"Shall the 15 mill tax limitation on the general ad valorem taxes within Kawkawlin Township imposed under Article IX, Section 6, of the Michigan Constitution be increased for Kawkawlin Township by 1.0 mill (\$1.00 per \$1,000.00 of taxable value) for the period of four (4) years, December 1, 2012 through December 1, 2015 inclusive, for the purpose of construction, maintenance and improvement of local public roads in Kawkawlin Township; and shall the Township levy an increase in millage for said purpose, thereby raising in the first year an estimated \$115,000.00?"

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MERRITT TOWNSHIP ROAD MILLAGE

PROPOSAL
"Shall Merritt Township levy up to 1.5 mills
(\$1.50 per \$1,000.00 of taxable value) above
the tax limitation imposed under Article IX,
Section 6, of the Michigan Constitution, and
levy it for five (5) years, December 1, 2013
through December 1, 2017 inclusive, for the
purpose of raising revenues for the
maintenance and improvement of public roads
in Merritt Township, raising an estimated
\$78,700.00 in the first year the millage is
levied?" If approved, this proposal constitutes
a renewal of the previously voted millage
within Merritt Township which will otherwise
expire on December 1, 2012.

HAMPTON TOWNSHIP ROAD MILLAGE RENEWAL PROPOSAL

"Shall the Charter Township of Hampton renew the current Road Fund millage of .65 mills on the taxable value of real and personal property situated in the Charter Township of Hampton, this millage being for the sole purpose of providing funds necessary to pay for construction, maintenance, or improvements of publicly owned roads, highways, streets, and parking lots within the Township, commencing December 1, 2013, and continuing for a period of ten (10) years?" This millage would generate approximately \$295,000.00 in the first year.

DELTA COLLEGE MILLAGE RENEWAL PROPOSAL

This proposal will permit Delta College to continue the current levy of millage for college purposes by renewing the College's authority to levy 0.4864 mill previously approved by the voters, which will expire after the 2015 levy. "Shall the previously approved 0.4864 mill expiring in 2015 be renewed so that the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be levied on taxable property in the Delta College district (comprised of the counties of Bay, Midland and Saginaw), be increased by 0.4864 mill (\$0.4864 per \$1,000 of taxable value) for eight (8) years, from 2016 to 2023 inclusive, to provide funds for community college purposes?" If approved, 0.4864 mill would generate an estimated \$5,390,103 for the College when first levied in 2016.

FRASER TOWNSHIP ROAD MILLAGE PROPOSAL

"Shall the 15 mill tax limitation on general ad valorem taxes within Fraser Township imposed under Article IX, Section 6, of the Michigan Constitution be increased for Fraser Township by 1.0 mill (\$1.00 per \$1,000.00 of taxable value) for the period of four (4) years, December 1, 2012 through December 1, 2015 inclusive, for the purpose of construction, maintenance and improvement of local public roads in Fraser Township; and shall the Township levy an increase in millage for said purpose, thereby raising in the first year an estimated \$90,000.00?"
