MARIJUANA PRODUCTS SHOULD BE:^{1, 3, 5}

- ▶ OUT OF SIGHT
- ▶ OUT OF REACH
- ▶ LOCKED IN A CABINET OR BOX
- ▶ PUT AWAY AFTER EVERY USE
- ▶ IN ORIGINAL PACKAGING AND CLEARLY LABELED

SAFETY INSIDE AND OUTSIDE THE HOME:

- ▶ CHANGE STORING METHODS AS CHILDREN GET OLDER^{1, 5}
- ▶ BEFORE PLAY-DATES, ASK PARENTS IF THEIR HOMES HAVE MARIJUANA AND HOW IT IS STORED^{2, 3}
- ▶ ASK GUESTS TO LEAVE MARIJUANA PRODUCTS AT THEIR HOMES³
- ▶ IF GUESTS DO BRING ANY MARIJUANA PRODUCTS, STORE THEM UP AND OUT OF SIGHT³
- ▶ TALK TO YOUR CHILDREN ABOUT MARIJUANA AND HOW TO RECOGNIZE IT³

SIGNS A CHILD ATE OR DRANK MARIJUANA:^{4, 5}

- DIFFICULTY BREATHING
- DIZZINESS
- FEELING SLEEPY
- TROUBLE SITTING UP
- SLOWED BREATHING
- TROUBLE WALKING

IF A CHILD SHOWS SYMPTOMS:^{2, 3, 5}

- CALL POISON CONTROL IMMEDIATELY
- CALL 911 IF THE CHILD IS HAVING A BAD REACTION
